Want to learn how to go beyond simply making static portraits of your subjects? Technological advances have now made stop-action photography accessible to virtually every photographer. This all-new program starts with using just your camera, natural light, and auto-focus for subjects on the move, such as birds in flight and running animals. We will discuss special exposure techniques for action, acquiring initial focus-lock, tracking your subject, optimizing your autofocus, and the creative doors opened by adding a simple infrared trigger system and much more!
